FOR THE WEEK OF FEBRUARY 27, 2022

SERMON OUTLINE

1. Preparation: God is moving in the hearts of people. Acts 10:1-35
2. Proclamation: God is saving through the Gospel. Acts 10:23-43
3. Confirmation: God is giving the Holy Spirit to Gentile believers. Acts 10:44-48
4. Celebration: God is building up His church. Acts 11:1-18

GROUP DISCUSSION

1. Looking back at the passage and your notes, is there anything you heard for the first time or something that caught your attention, challenged, or confused you?
2. What sorts of dietary rules were Jews supposed to follow (Leviticus 11)? What other kinds of rules about cleanliness were there? What was God teaching Peter through his vision?
3. What truths are essential to the Gospel? In other words, what basic truths must we be sure we share when “share the Gospel” with someone?
4. How can you know for sure that you’ve been saved? In other words, how can you have assurance of your own salvation, especially in times of doubt?
5. What did the circumcision party criticize Peter about in Acts 11? What sorts of things does the church tend to fight over or be divided over today? What can we do to help maintain unity in the body of Christ?

BREAKOUT DISCUSSION

1. Last month we identified a particular person in each of our lives we would try to share the Gospel with in 2022. Update the group with how it’s going. Have you made any progress since last month? What’s your next step?
2. Share how you have seen God build up City on a Hill and the global Church that you can celebrate together. Pray together, thanking God for the ways we get to see Him work even today.

PRAYER POINTS

1. Praise God for growing and building our church family in the midst of a pandemic and for the hope of a future, better life with Christ
2. Pray for believers in Ukraine and other believers around the world for strong faith and protection.
3. Ask God to help us love everyone, despite social status, race, or any other difference, especially when they join us on a Sunday morning.
